AANZFTA Rules of Origin

- > Wholly Obtained Goods (WO)
- > Goods Produced From Originating Materials (PE)
- > Change in tariff classification (CTC)
- > Regional Value Content (RVC)
- > The “General Rule”



WHOLLY OBTAINED (WO)

Originating goods are those goods that are wholly obtained or produced entirely in a Party, such as:

- > ***minerals, live animals or by-products, hunted or trapped products, organic produce***

Such goods must not contain any foreign materials, or parts, from anywhere other than from a Party to the Agreement

GOODS PRODUCED FROM ORIGINATING MATERIALS (PE)

These are goods that are produced entirely in a Party from originating materials

E.G, a handbag manufactured in Laos comprised of;

- tanned sheep leather the produce of New Zealand,
- thread from Malaysia,
- clasp and zipper from Indonesia,

would qualify as an originating good



CHANGE IN TARIFF CLASSIFICATION (CTC)

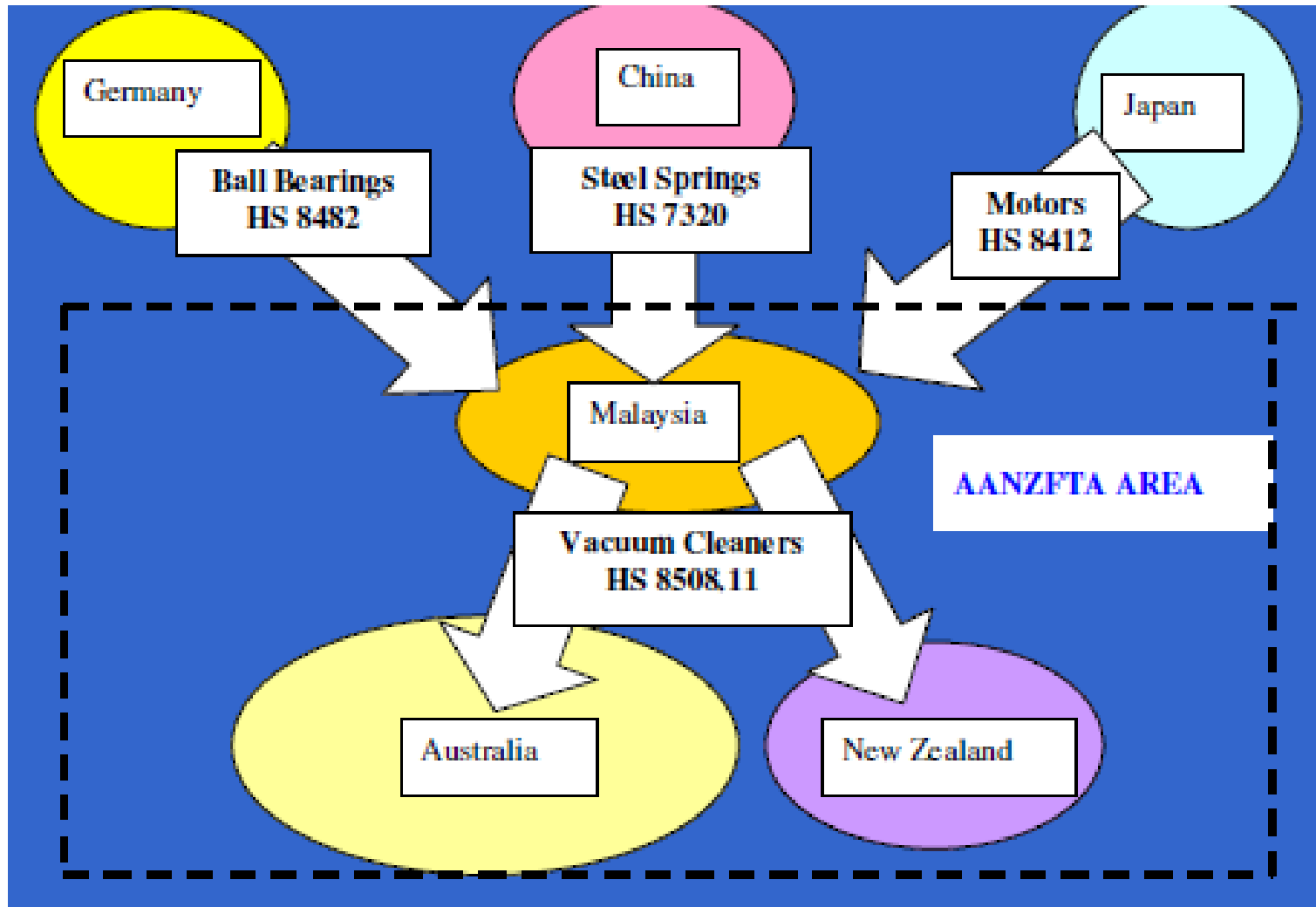
- > The principle of CTC is that a good, after production, must not have the same classification (HS code) under the Harmonized System (HS) as the non- Originating material had before the production
- > *It is only the non-originating materials used to produce a good that are required to satisfy a CTC requirement*



CHANGE IN TARIFF CLASSIFICATION (CTC) - Example



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REGIONAL VALUE CONTENT (RVC)

The RVC Rule of Origin refers to the total percentage of originating materials contained in the final product (sourced from any Party), minimum 40%

There are two approaches to calculate the RVC:

- > • the “Direct Formula”; and
- > • the “Indirect / Build-Down Formula”



THE 'GENERAL RULE'

- > The 'General Rule' provides an option of meeting either a RVC(40) or CTC of requirement.

OPERATIONAL CERTIFICATION PROCEDURES

Preferential treatment under the FTA requires a Certificate of Origin (CO)

AANZFTA Preferential CO can be issued only by a registered authority with the ASEAN Secretariat; CCIQ

When applying with CCIQ for AANZFTA CO, an exporter must complete:

- AANZFTA registration form &
- AANZFTA Certificate of Origin template

Submit the completed Exporter's registration & AANZFTA CO to intl@cciq.com.au





OPERATIONAL CERTIFICATION PROCEDURES

Data required to be included on the CO :

- > Exporters details, Shipment Details, Full description of goods (incl. FOB value & Gross weight), Origin Criterion and the Declaration by the Exporter

The CO should be submitted with supporting documentation i.e. Bill of Lading or Commercial Invoice

The Certificate of Origin may be able to be issued retroactively and under the AANZFTA is valid for up to 12 months
